What are they?

Community schools partner with agencies and local governments to align community resources to improve student outcomes. These partnerships "provide an integrated focus on academics, health and social services, youth and community development, and community engagement."[1] Many community schools operate year-round, morning to evening, and serve children and adults. Community schools often serve neighborhoods with prevalent economic and social learning barriers.

THE IMPACT OF COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

"Community school strategies can be an effective approach to mitigate the academic and social impacts of emergencies that affect local communities, improve school responsiveness to student and family needs, and organize school and community resources to address barriers to learning."[1] Meeting the needs of children by building a positive school climate through trusting relationships, combined with rich learning opportunities that prepare all students to succeed in life, is the foundation of the program.
