

Engagement is much different when you're in person, and I noticed such a difference with kids.



THE READING SKILLS PROGRAM INITIATIVE

The district's Expanded Learning Director led the charge to introduce the Reading Skills Program to Norris School District, **seeking creative and innovative approaches to assist students beyond traditional methods.**

Inspired by personal experience as a parent and the success her daughter found with the consumer program, the director introduced the school-based IRD Summer Reading Program to address learning gaps. **The program targeted foster youth, English Learners (EL), homeless students, and those from socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds**—groups that performed lower on the California School Dashboard.

RESULTS AND OUTCOMES

The 5-week Reading Skills Program provided elementary and middle school students with weekly classes focused on foundational skills development, dedicated reading practice, and one-on-one support from instructors. Pre- and post-assessment scores below demonstrate improvements across various reading skills.





Table 2: Improvement Adjusted for Summer Slide

The data clearly illustrates that students who participated in the program not only improved their reading skills but also outperformed peers who did not participate, compensating for the typical regression associated with the Summer Slide.
